



2013 IWGA HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE, RENEE SLONE

On September 18, 2013, the Illinois Women's Golf Association (IWGA) inducted University of Illinois head women's golf coach, **Renee Slone**, into their Hall of Fame. She becomes just the fifth member to be inducted into this prestigious group.

"I am humbled by this honor as it not only recognizes my playing accomplishments but more importantly the impact I have had on women's golf in the state of Illinois," Slone said. "I am privileged to have the opportunity to assist young women achieve their athletic, academic and personal goals every day. I feel fortunate to have been able to introduce the game of golf to numerous individuals through clinics, camps and lessons. I am honored to receive recognition for my 34 years of involvement in this great game."

"The IWGA Hall of Fame was established to recognize women from the State of Illinois who have made exceptional contributions to the game of golf on behalf of the girls and women of Illinois," current IWGA board member Suzanne Younger said. "Renee Slone has impacted golf in Illinois both as an exceptional player and as a role model for the girls and young women who will follow in her footsteps."

Slone is undoubtedly the most decorated women's golfer in Illinois history. During her senior season in 1993, she averaged a school-record 74.33 strokes per round, claimed a school-record eight medalist titles, including the Big Ten Championship, and was named the 1993 National College Player of the Year by both the National Golf Coaches Association (NGCA) and Golf Week Magazine. Throughout her career she was a three-time All-American, claimed three straight top-10 finishes at the NCAA Championships and was a two-time Big Ten Player of the Year and Big Ten Championship Medalist.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

2014 has arrived and it looks to be another exciting summer for amateur golf in Illinois!

Through three state tournaments in 2013, IWGA provided the opportunities for women of all ages to participate in tournament play. With the putts, the chips to the green, and those long drives, women challenged the courses and vied for the lowest scores – all while enjoying the game of golf.

In June, the Women's State Amateur Championship Tournament was held at Cantigny in Wheaton. With 80 participants and some on the waiting list, the tournament site



was one of the best. Excitement was high as the Championship Match was still tied after 18 holes. Bing Singhsumalee of Naperville defeated Lauren English of Bloomington, with a chip-in on the 19th hole.

Again this year, we saw a record number of girls (74) at the IWGA Junior Girls' Championship Tournament in Savoy. The 2013 tournament winner was Renee Solberg of Wheaton, and the runner up was Angie Kim of Schaumburg. A special presentation of the Julia Dodd's Award was made to Laurel Enstrom, Rock Island.

Last but certainly not least of our tournaments was the Women's State Senior Amateur Championship. The Den at Fox Creek, Bloomington, provided a challenging week to the women — don't ever doubt those women 50 years or plus. The bent grass tees, greens, and fairways complimented the wild prairie grasses for a Scottish links style course. The winners for the tournament were low gross, Leslie Page of Medinah; low net, Laurie Redden of Coal Valley; and super senior, Ruth Femali of Medinah. IWGA recognized Renee Slone, University of Illinois Women's Golf Coach and multiple winner of IWGA events, by inducting her into our Hall of Fame.

Your support of the IWGA Victory Tournaments continues to provide funding for women's golf programs through out the State of Illinois. Again in 2013, we contributed \$2500 to each of our ten public university women's golf teams. We thank you and your clubs for another successful year of Victory Tournaments. We hope your club will participate next year and join in our mission.

As we look ahead, plans for 2014 are set for another strong year of women's amateur golf. Our tournament sites are: State Am – Crestwicke Country Club, Bloomington; Junior Amateur – U of I Orange Course, Savoy; and Senior Amateur at Soangetaha Country Club, Galesburg. Beginning in 1986, she began to devote her time and energies to running a retail business, so any sport activities were set aside.

It wasn't until 1998, when she met her current husband, Dean, that she began play golf. Totally smitten with it, she has belonged to the Highland Park Women's League in Bloomington for almost fifteen years, serving as president, as well as belonging to the BNWGA inter-club committee. Though officially retired, Ginny, has a seasonal job in the pro-shop at The Den at Fox Creek. She has been involved in helping organize their various outings and tournaments. VICTORY TOURNAMENT

During World War II, the IWGA began the Victory Tournament to show support for our men in uniform. The first tournament was held in 1941 to raise money for veterans' hospitals. Still in existence today, these philanthropic efforts raise over \$20,000 each year. Of all state women's golf organizations, Illinois is the only one with this type of charitable giving. Total contributions exceeding \$1,094,000 have been donated over the past sixty two years to the IWGA Victory Tournament Fund.

Victory Charities and the John Deere Classic

The IWGA VICTORY CHARITIES qualify for the John Deere Classic Birdies for Charity Program. John Deere sponsors the John Deere Classic held at the TPC course in Silvis, Illinois. Pledge cards are available for anyone interested in pledging at least a penny for each birdie they think will be made during play of the John Deere Classic. This year there were 2160 birdies made. If you pledged a penny a birdie, you were billed \$21.60. Every penny of that goes to the charity of your choice. IWGA is pleased to be listed as one of the hundreds of charities. And, if you pick the correct amount of birdies, you win a prize. There were 100 people guessing the correct amount and their names were put in a drawing for a new 201.3 Chevy Malibu. USGA STATE TEAM





The USGA Women's State Team Championship was held at NCR Country Club in Kettering, Ohio on September 17-19, 2013. The event was three days of stroke play with 2 of the 3 team member's scores counting each day. Representing Illinois last year were: Nora Lucas, Laura Carson and Alyssa Guadio. They finisihed in 20th place, a good finish for Illinois.

The USGA instituted the State Team Tournament in 1995 in celebration of its centennial. The format was similar to the World Amateur Team Championship, where the men and women compete in separate tournaments. Each state sent three men and three women to represent them in the tournament. The tournament was so popular that it has been designated a bi-annual event.

In 1999, the responsibility for team selection was assigned to the IWGA. To aid in determining the best players to represent the State, the IWGA established a point system to assist with the selection process. Points are accumulated by participation in state, local, and national tournaments. Qualifying tournaments are classified by type, including qualifying rounds for match-play tournaments. A committee from the IWGA reviews the tournaments and assigns the maximum point value which will be available for that tournament.

The winner of an eligible tournament receives 100% of the maximum point value for that tournament, with subsequent finishers receiving a percentage of that maximum value as determined by their finish position. To be eligible for selection, the player must reside in Illinois. College players are ineligible due to NCAA rules. Since the goal is to select the women who are most representative of Illinois, the points for Illinois tournaments are weighted heavier than their national counterparts. In addition, since it is a two year selection process, the point values for the first year of the selection period are de-valued by 50%, to attempt to insure that the players who are selected have been performing well in the year prior to the tournament. ILLINOIS WOMEN'S AMATEUR GOLF CHAMPIONSHIP

June 28, 2013. On a perfect summer day at Cantigny Golf Club in Wheaton, **Bing Singhsumalee**, Naperville, conquered Cantigny and her opponent to win the 80th Annual Women's State Amateur sponsored by the Illinois Women's Golf Association. Bing defeated **Lauren English**, Bloomington, on the 19th hole with a chip-in to win her first state amateur title. Bing is a 16-year old student at Waubonsie Valley HS and has been playing golf since she was four. Lauren English started playing competitive golf at age 5 with two siblings and her parents who are both golf pros at Crestwicke Country Club. Lauren's brother, Kyle, is an assistant pro at Crestwicke and in the Illinois PGA program. Lauren attends the University of Iowa on a golf scholarship. She is majoring in business.

18-year old Defending Champion, **Elizabeth Szokal**, Winnetka, and Bing shared medalist honors in the qualifying round. Both shot a one over par 73.

Sisters and a mother/daughter team were well represented at Catigny. Sisters Allison and Kiley Walsh grew up together playing golf and were paired against each other in the first round. On the eighteenth hole, Allison, who will be a sophomore at Bradley, went one-up to defeat Kiley, a senior at Mt. Prospect High. Sisters Taylor and Connie Ellett, Hampshire, are both on the NIU golf team. They went on to win their flights. Sisters Ariana Furrie (18 years old) and Gianna (14 Years old), from St. Charles also participated. Ariana, won her flight. The Tyler sisters, Sydney and Alexa, Bloomington, are also avid golfers, and like all of the above sisters, have played in several IWGA sponsored tournaments. Alexa, a junior at Wheaton College, was the 2011 winner of the Julia Dodds Award. Allison Walsh also won the award in 2012. New IWGA Board member, Jessica Lederhausen and daughter, Rosanna, Hinsdale, both competed in the Championship Flight.



Kim and Solberg shot one-under-par 75s two strokes ahead of four players who tied with a 77. The battle continued the second day with Renee shooting 150 to edge out Angie by one stroke for the Championship title. Third place went to Paige Jordan, St. Charles, with a 153, followed closely by Kelly Anderson, also from Wheaton, with a 154.


She will continue her golf career at St. Cloud State in Minnesota.
