



During World War II, the IWGA began the Victory Tournament to show support for our men in uniform. The first tournament was held in 1941 to raise money for veterans' hospitals. Still in existence today, the philanthropic efforts raise over \$20,000 each year. Of all the state women's golf organizations, Illinois is the only one with this type of charitable giving. In 2009 over \$1,000,000 in total contributions has been donated to the IWGA Victory Fund. Three clubs increased their donations. Buffalo Grove increased its contribution by \$353; Kishwaukee increased \$333; and Medinah came in with a \$2,400 donation, \$690 above the 2008 amount!

ABOUT 100 PUBLIC AND PRIVATE GOLF COURSES ACROSS Illinois host IWGA Victory Tournaments. The 76th annual Illinois Women's Amateur Championship was held at Kankakee Country Club on June 16-19. The deceptively fast greens proved to be challenging for the the talented field of amateur women golfers. **Brooke Beeler** from Butler, the 2008 Champion, returned to defend her title and four other IWGA champions were in the strong field. 80% of the field had handicaps of 10 or less.

Holding a three-hole lead with only four holes to go, **Beth Weinstein**, Highland Park, looked to have control in the champion-ship flight final match. But her opponent, **Chelsea Renee Harris**, Metropolis, rallied and won three straight holes to force a play-off. Three agonizing holes later, Beth was able to clinch the title. Beth said the tough matches she played all week will help her confidence and resolve in her senior year at Wisconsin.

.Katherine Hepler, Lincoln, won a two-hole playoff over defending champion Ember Schuldt, Sterling, to win the 30th Illinois Junior Girls' Championship at the University of Illinois Orange Course. It was the sixth time playing in the tournament for Katherine, who is a sophomore at Normal University High School. She celebrated her 15th birthday on the first day of play by shooting a 6 under par 70 and capturing medalist honors. Ember, now a U of I freshman, almost won the playoff on the first hole. She was ten feet away from the hole with an eagle opportunity when Katherine hit a wedge from 50 yards out that hit the pin and lipped out of the hole to about three feet away. Ember missed her put and they both got birdies to continue the match. Katherine parred the second hole to win the match.

**Lauren English**, Bloomington and **Katie Jean**, Rantoul, finished at 148 tie for third place with Lauren winning a one-hole playoff. All other flights also had ties which were decided by scorecard playoffs.

This was the I7th year of awarding the Julia Dodds Junior Award. Julia Dodds was a long time member of the IWGA. The IWGA is aware that many of the girls who have played in the tournament exemplify these qualities but only one may be selected.

The 2009 recipient, **Melanie Walsh**, Mt. Prospect, has played in the IWGA Junior Girls' Golf Championship for 3 years. At Mt. Prospect High School her academic, athletic, school activities and leadership contributions were outstanding. Academically, Melanie ranked at the top of her class. She played both varsity golf and badminton. She also participated in many community service projects helping those less fortunate. She achieved extraordinary success in

## SENIOR WOMEN'S AMATEUR GOLF CHAMPIONSHIP

The 40th annual Senior Women's Amateur Championship at Mattoon Golf and Country Club will be remembered for its final rained soaked day. The headlines in the local paper "Rain can't prevent this mudder" pretty much described the results. Salley Wessels, Mt. Morris, hung on to claim her eighth Senior title with rounds of 75, 80, and 83 for a 238 to squeak by runner-up Laura Carson, Lake Bluff, by one stroke. This was Laura's second runner-up award. Her first was in 2006 when she turned 50 and qualified for the senior age limit. Playing in another foursome, Laura didn't know how close she was to Salley, but she played well to shoot a 79 to go with her previous days of 80. This was the second championship in three years for Salley, who turned 70 this year. She has been playing in senior events a bit longer than Laura and won her first senior title when she was 52. She said she lifts weights in the winter to keep up with all the younger women.

With rain soaking the course for 2 out of the 3 days, local player, **Brenda Fletcher**, and Course Superintendent, Tom Woodward, felt the course held up very well and was in great shape considering the sometimes heavy rain. All of the players found the course to be challenging but fun. The contestants also appreciated the many volunteer ball spotters and delicious on course snacks. Third Low Gross for the field was Rosalie Barnet, Moline with 243, Judy Parr, Rockford won Low Net for the

## HISTORY OF THE JUNIOR GIRLS' TOURNAMENT

In the late 1970's **Jan Fuller** (IWGA Board member since 2007) approached **Marlene Miller** (IWGA Board member since 1975) about having the IWGA sponsor a Junior Tournament. They were both high school coaches and knew there were not many tournaments for girls. The IWGA Board accepted the idea and went to work on a plan.

It was decided to base it in Champaign because a number of Board members lived in the area. Also to have it at the U of I course where the cost would be modest and it would be centrally located in the state. It was to be modeled after the Women's Western lunior Tournament. One of the dorms on campus was contracted

for a place for the girls to stay. The IWGA provided transportation to and from the golf course and had a picnic at a local park. These things were done to make young girls who had not much tournament experience away from home feel welcome. As the years went on, these things became unnecessary.

The first year (1980) there were about 60 entries. The number slowly went down for a few years but recently has stabilized to between 80 and 90. Starting in 2010 the field will be limited to 84 (see *Board Notes on page 3*).

The IWGA has a close relationship with the golf pros and course superintendents at the tournaments we hold. We sometimes get credit for running a smooth tournament but the credit also should also o to local professionals who condition the courses and supply local and professional knowledge on golf issues.

The Head PGA Professional at Kankakee Country Club, **Paul Reinking,** is a outstanding pro. 2009 was Paul's 34th season at Kankakee C.C. He has been involved with the PGA at a state level since 1977 and served as President in 1993-4. At the national level he has served on the National PGA Board since 2001. He has won numerous awards, including Illinois Professional of the Year 1994, Illinois Junior Golf leader Award 1955, 1957, and Illinois Junior Golf Association Distinguished Service Award 1999. He was named to the Illinois Golf Hall of Fame in 2005. Among the highlights of his long career were playing golf with Nancy Lopez and Fred Couples when they visited Kankakee.
