



#### **2011 IWGA HALL OF FAME**

The 2011 Illinois Women's Golf Association Hall of Fame Inductee, Marlene Miller of Lake Bluff, has spent a lifetime developing her unique talents and sharing them with others. Her list of golf-related activities would exhaust even the most energetic golf enthusiast. She has served on the IWGA Board of Directors since 1975, including a two-year term as its president, as well as co-founding the IWGA Illinois Junior Girls' Tournament in 1979 and chairing it from its inception until 2010. She also co-founded the Julia Dodds Scholarship Award in 1992 and continues to chair the project.

Other volunteer activities include serving as Director of the Women's Western Golf Association for three years, member of the USGA Junior Girls Committee for eight years, Illinois Junior Golf Association Governing Board, and USGA Women's Committee from 1995-1999. Locally in Lake Bluff she has been president of the Lake Bluff Park Board and chair of its golf committee. She has been awarded the Chicago District Golf Association Distinguished Service Award and has been inducted into four other Halls of Fame.

Dear Friends,

What an honor and privilege it is to be President of such an amazing organization and wonderful group of women! 2011 was a great year for the IWGA. All three tournaments were well attended and we had some of the strongest fields ever. The State Am was held at Kishwaukee CC in DeKalb. Fifty-one of the 72 participants had an index of 10.0 or less.

The junior tournament held annually at the U of I orange course remains strong. This year there were 68 participants, less than we hoped for, but efforts

to avoid conflicts with other tournaments were nearly impossible.



The senior tournament remains the most popular of all three. Each year we have a full field of 120 ladies and have a waiting list. The host club this year was Oakwood CC in Coal Valley. We added a super senior division this year. There were eight in the class of 75 and over. This was a wonderful addition to the championship.

If you haven't checked our website, you need to!! This is something that the IWGA board has worked very hard to develop and keep current so you have the latest information for upcoming IWGA events. Char McLear and Mary Robson have taken the lead on this project and have done an outstanding job.

Marlene Miller was inducted into the IWGA Hall of Fame, established in 2008. Marlene's many golf accomplishments and volunteer involvement with golf were shared with everyone at the state senior championship banquet. Marlene joins past recipients, Shirley Dommers and Lois Drafke (2008) and Evelyn Davis (2009). CONGRATULATIONS Marlene!

A most important aspect of Marlene's career is her current job as the girls' golf team coach at Lake Forest High School, a position she has held for thirty-three years. Under her tutelage, her teams won the Illinois State High School Championship in 1996 and 1998 and were runners-up in 1997 by one stroke.

If any of her administrative tasks should fall through, Marlene is also an accomplished amateur golfer. Playing competitively since she was in her teens, her wins include titles in Minnesota and Illinois from the mid-1950's, when she was a student at the University of Minnesota, to IWGA Senior Women's Champion in 1987 and 1988. For example, before she married and moved to Illinois, Marlene won the Minnesota Amateur Championship in 1954, 1955 and 1960. She was NCAA medalist in 1954. With her Minnesota connections, she was asked to play three exhibition games with Patty Berg, a highlight of her career.

Marriage and motherhood followed soon after college and replaced golf for awhile but even with four children, she never completely abandoned the sport. Interestingly, because she still participates in amateur competitions, it is not unusual for her to be paired with a younger woman who knows her as "Coach" Miller. Such a unique situation exemplifies how golf can close the generation gap and emphasizes the importance of strong role models. "I think young people really need to know that they are supported by adults, " says Marlene. "They need to be able to come to our tournaments and sense a friendliness and encouragement from us." With Marlene Miller, the human side always prevails. "A quality that is most easy for me to use, whether I'm rules chairman or something else is that I feel most natural to be in a kind of nurturing position."

When asked what is her greatest accomplishment, Marlene doesn't hesitate to say her marriage to Wendell, her children Julie, Robin, Muffet and Peter, and her five grandchildren and one great-grandchild.

#### **VICTORY TOURNAMENT**

During World War II, the IWGA began the Victory Tournament to show support for our men in uniform. The first tournament was held in 1941 to raise money for veterans' hospitals. Still in existence today, the philanthropic efforts raise over \$20,000 each year. Of all the state women's golf organizations, Illinois is the only one with this type of charitable giving. Total contributions exceeding \$1,050,000 have been donated over the past fifty one years to the IWGA Victory Tournament Fund.

#### Victory Fund Welcomes Chicago State University

In 2011 the IWGA Board of Directors voted to add Chicago State University to the list of public state universities receiving \$2500 stipends to support their women's golf teams. Of their six varsity team members, five are from Chicago.

About 100 public and private golf courses across Illinois host IWGA Victory Tournaments. These Victory Tournaments enable the IWGA to contribute \$25,000 per year to the (now) ten Illinois public university women's golf teams. In addition to

#### **ILLINOIS WOMEN'S AMATEUR GOLF CHAMPIONSHIP**

The 78th annual Illinois Women's Amateur Championship was held at Kishwaukee Country Club, DeKalb on June 14-17. The local committee headed by Ruth Heal and Bobbie Cesarek was outstanding, and the Kishwakee staff was extremely helpful and conscientious helping all the contestants endure sometimes cold and rainy weather. In the field of 72 players, 51 had handicap indexes of less than 10.0.

University of Illinois senior Nora Lucas, Chicago, took advantage of two late bogeys by Defending Champion, Brittany Atterbury, Rockton, in a 2 and 1 victory in the final match. After an errant drive on the dogleg 14th hole that cost her a bogey, two time State Am long drive champ, Lucas, put her driver in her bag, ended up winning the 15th hole, and did not not relinquish her lead. "Nora made a putt when she had to make a putt," Atterbury said. "That shows what a good player she is."





A full field of 120 golfers competed in the 41st annual Illinois Senior Women's Golf Championship, conducted by the Illinois Women's Golf Association, September 20-22, at Oakwood Country Club in Coal Valley. A very talented field of amateur women golfers, age 50 and older played in the tournament.

The beautiful Oakwood Country Club's course was designed by Pete Dye in 1965 and underwent a major renovation in 2009. Although sometimes windy and overcast, the weather cooperated all week with no rain. This year's champion was **Mary Kay Thanos-Zordani** from Chicago with a 235 total. Runner-up was a tie between three time champion **Char McLear**, McHenry, and defending champion **Roberta Sentel** from Marion, both with a three day total of 240. Roberta also had the lowest round of 77. Low net for the field was **Kathy Parker**, Virden, with a net 218.

#### **2012 RULES OF GOLF CHANGES**

Change comes slowly in golf, a game that traces its origins to 15th century Scotland. Its longstanding rules endure even when they seem to defy logic. But change is not unheard of and every four years the USGA and R&A (formerly the Royal and Ancient Golf Club) agree to changes to improve clarity and ensure penalties are proportionate.

A noticeable procedural change is that for the first time in the history of the two governing bodies they will jointly publish one "Rules of Golf". Of the nine changes to the 34 playing rules, two are particularly notable.

No longer will a player be penalized a stroke if the wind moves a ball while he is in stance to swing when he is

virtually certain that he did not cause the ball to move. *Ball Moving After Address (Rule 18-2b)* 

It will now be OK for a player to smooth the sand in a bunker any time even before playing a shot as long as he doesn't gain an advantage. Ball in Hazard; Prohibited Actions (Rule 13-4)
