Ember Schuldt, Sterling, 2008, and 2010 IWGA Junior Girl's Amateur Champion and 2010 Julia Dodds Award Winner, joins a very select group of women who have won both an IWGA tournament and have received the Julia Dodds Award. Along with Ember, Laura Patrick, 1996 Junior Champion and 1997 Julia Dodds Awardee, Elizabeth Burden, 1999 Awardee and 2001 State Women's Amateur Champion, and Chelsea Bach, 2002 Junior Champion and 2003 Awardee, have been double recipients.

The Julia H. Dodds Junior Girl's Award was established in 1992 to honor an outstanding graduating high school senior. The award is in honor of Mrs. Dodds who was the first 50 year member of the IWGA. She believed that golf is a sport that combines the best that nature and man have to offer, making it a game of character and sportsmanship.

To be considered for the award, the player must have letters of recommendation from two high school teachers and must meet the award criteria. Criteria for selection include: Character, Scholarship, Leadership, and Sportsmanship.


The IWGA Junior Girls Championship provides stiff competition for the top spot, while flight divisions allow other young women the opportunity to compete with their peers for flight championships including a variety of ability levels. The IWGA State Amateur has become an extremely competitive four-day match play event with a 32-person championship flight, the majority of whom sport handicaps in the low single digits. The IWGA Senior Championship attracts a waiting list to its three-day competitive stroke play event for women 50 and over while providing senior women of varying ages and ability levels the camaraderie and fun of playing with other golf-loving women from across the state.

IWGA Victory Tournaments held at clubs around the state continue to provide funding for girls' and women's golf programs - including all nine of our public university women's golf teams. These funds are vital to our mission of passing the love of golf on to the next generations of women in Illinois and ultimately to the future of golf and country clubs who will only succeed with a broad base of future golfers. Victory Funds have provided over \$1,000,000 of grants since its inception.

2011 Marks Victory Tournament's 50th Year

During World War II, the IWGA began the Victory Tournament to show support for our men in uniform. The first tournament was held in 1941 to raise money for veterans' hospitals. Still in existence today, the philanthropic efforts raise over \$20,000 each year. Of all the state women's golf organizations, Illinois is the only one with this type of charitable giving. Total contributions exceeding \$1,000,000 have been donated over the past fifty years to the IWGA Victory Tournament Fund.

Two public clubs, **Wilmette G.C.** and **Buffalo Grove G.C.** love the prizes and add such things as advertising on

holes by local companies, raffles, and including male golfers in the event. Both usually are able to donate over \$2,000. Private clubs who may not be able to have a public event with outside advertising may have large donations because they assess their members. **Medinah C.C.** with their very large membership raised \$2,562 by charging the golfers \$15. **Oakwood C.C.** was able to raise \$500with an assessment. Other large donations, ranging from \$900 to \$1,590, came from: **Butterfield C.C.**, **Itasca C.C.**, **Kishwaukee C.C.**, **McHenry C.C.**, and **Oak Park C.C.**

The IWGA urges any group considering a donation that the Victory Tournament Fund is not a race to the largest amount. If your group only has 20 golfers and chooses to donate \$5 for the season, that is \$100 and lots of one hundreds go a long way to support our in-state causes.

Victory Fund Welcomes New Team

In 2010 the IWGA Board of Directors voted to add **Chicago State University** to the list of public state universities receiving \$2500 stipends to support their women's golf teams.

About 100 PUBLIC AND PRIVATE GOLF COURSES across Illinois host IWGA Victory Tournaments. These Victory Tournaments enable the IWGA to contribute \$22,500 per year to the (now) nine Illinois public university Women's golf teams. In addition to supporting our universities, an individual award is granted to a graduating high school senior and stipend

to USGA Junior and state team qualifiers, the IWGA hold true to its origins with support of veterans' programs and medical research.

ILLINOIS WOMEN'S AMATEUR GOLF CHAMPIONSHIP

The 77th annual Illinois Women's Amateur Championship was held at Flossmoor Country Club on June 8 - 11. The classic 110 year old course designed by Herbert J. Tweedie, was recently renovated by golf architect, Raymond Hearn, and was selected as the 2009 Renovation of the Year by Golf Magazine.

Even with overnight rain and day-long drizzle, opening qualifying day on the 5942 yard, par 74 course didn't deter **Katherine Hepler** from Lincoln, the 2009 Junior Champion, from shooting a 76 to capture the Medalist and Junior Medalist Awards. On the first day of match-play, **Chelsea Michalek** of Glenview made a hole-in-one on the 122 yard 13th hole. The last time a hole-in-one took place in the IWGA sponsored Women's Amateur was in 1999, when **Lynne Frary**, past IWGA President, got an ace.

In the final championship match, **Brittany Atterbury** of Rockton, a University of Northern Iowa senior, waged a battle with **Jamie Lavin** from Deerfield, a Junior at Penn State. Atterbury took an early lead and closed the match on the 15th hole to win the match 4 & 3.

At the kick-off dinner on Tuesday night, President **Pam Keeling** announced the opening day event winners. Besides the afore mentioned Katherine Hepler, Lincoln Elks teammates **Jan Bower** and **Susan Shigemura** won the low net team trophy, and **Pam Sherry**, Springfield, was the Young at Heart recipient. **Ember Schudt** of Sterling won the prestigious Julia Dodds Junior Award.

ILLINOIS JUNIOR GIRLS' GOLF CHAMPIONSHIP

Ember Schuldt of Sterling, the 2008 Junior Girls' Champion, had a winning streak of 8 under par on the first day of the 31st Illinois Junior Girls' Championship at the University of Illinois Orange Course, followed by a 7 under par on the second day, to win the tournament. Her total score of 137, a IWGA tournament record, was 7 strokes ahead of Katherine Hepler, Lincoln, the 2009 Junior Girls' Champion. Kaitlin Reid of Normal placed third. Cynthia Bounleutay, Rockford, edged out Bree Veazey, Olympia Fields, in a playoff for fourth place.

Ember showed her strength by winning the long drive hole in her age group and the field with a 245 yard drive. Team Event winners were: **Katherine Hepler** and **Sheinnera Gerongay**, University High School in Bloomington, for the Low Gross, and **Rachel Lawless** and **Emily Mick**, Mt. Prospect High School, for the Low Net.

JULIA DODDS JUNIOR AWARD

As mentioned on the front page of this newsletter, **Ember Schuldt** joins an elite group of women to win both an IWGA tournament and the Julia Dodds Junior Award. She is the only one to win both in the same year. The Julia Dodds Junior Girl's Award was established in 1992 to honor an outstanding graduating high school senior.

Ember graduated second in her Sterling High School class. Her chemistry teacher wrote: "Ember has a strong work ethic and is always willing to help her peers when needed. Beyond academics she is viewed by her peers as a leader and role model. She is one of the most outstanding athletes in our school's history."

In golf, Ember was captain of the team all four years, undefeated in dual and triangular meets, and placed third in the Illinois State High School Tournament. She also played basketball, was Junior Class Treasurer, in the marching band and numerous clubs. In her free time she works at Rock River C.C. and Emerald Hills Golf Learning Center mowing greens. She is looking forward to continuing her golf career at the University of Illinois.

ILLINOIS SENIOR WOMEN'S AMATEUR CHAMPIOSHIP

A full field of 120 golfers competed in the 41st Annual Illinois Senior Women's Golf Championship, conducted by the Illinois Women's Golf Association, September 14 - 16 at Stone Creek Golf Club in Urbana, Illinois. A very talented field of amateur women golfers, age 50 and older competed in the tournament.

On the 5486 yard par 72 course, four players carded a 76 on the first day to lead the field: Carol Stack, Champaign; Laura Carson, Lake Bluff; Mo Sheehan, Grayslake; and Roberta Sentel, Marion. Following one stroke behind were: Colleen Dold, Decatur, and Salley Wessels, Mt. Morris, a seven time winner of IWGA Tournaments.

The weather was beautiful the first two days of play, but on the third day the wind picked up and changed the course into a different, meaner animal. In the final round, Roberta Sentel shot a 79 for a 54 hole total of 234 to capture the tournament championship. Laura Carson and Ann Harshman, Decatur, both shot 77 for a total 238 to tie for second place. Low Net for the field was Connie Pierce from Champaign with a net 215.
